1767 Construction of the summer retreat, Cliveden, completed.

1770 Phyllis Wheatley (1753-1784) wrote her most well known poem *An Elegiac Poem, on the Death of that Celebrated Divine, and Eminent Servant of Jesus Christ, the Reverend and Learned George Whitefield.*

1776 The North American colonies declare their independence from England.

1780 The Pennsylvania legislature ratified the Act of Gradual Emancipation, the terms of which were so gradual that some enslaved were not emancipated for at least 28 years.

1861 The Civil War began and lasted four years.

1863 The Emancipation Proclamation, issued on January 1, 1863, freed enslaved people in areas still in rebellion against the United States.

1872 Author and leader in the women's suffrage movement Victoria Woodhull (1838-1927) ran for president.

1920 The 19th Amendment granted women the right to vote.

1941 The United States entered World War II.

1955 Rosa Parks (1913-2005) resisted bus segregation with her refusal to give her seat to a white rider.

1972 Title 9 prohibited discrimination based on sex in education and programs that receive federal funding.

1973 The landmark decision by the Supreme Court in Roe vs. Wade protected a woman's right to have an abortion. In this same year, Cliveden open as a museum.
